Toll Revenue and Traffic Statistics Update for Q2 2021

Atlas Arteria (ASX:ALX) today released toll revenue and traffic statistics for the June quarter 2021 (Q2 2021) which showed encouraging signs of improvement from May, during the period following the easing of COVID-19 movement restrictions in Europe.

Weighted average¹ traffic was 68.5% higher and weighted average toll revenue was 57.3% higher for Q2 2021 than Q2 2020, which was significantly impacted by COVID-19 lockdown restrictions. When compared to Q2 2019, which was unaffected by the pandemic, weighted average traffic was only 18.9% lower and weighted average toll revenue only 13.6% lower in Q2 2021. The tables below show the change in traffic and revenue with respect to the same periods in 2019 and 2020.

APRR and ADELAC


The quarter began with the continued nationwide lockdowns across France. Restrictions began to ease from early May, first with the re-opening of schools, then restaurants and bars, non-essential shops and services. Curfews, which had been in place since December 2020, were lifted in June when cross border travel recommenced under the new EU health pass system.

Traffic has recovered as COVID-19 movement restrictions eased. Traffic over Q2 2021 was 69.5% higher than Q2 2020, but 17.0% lower than Q2 2019. Light vehicle traffic finished 82.4% higher than Q2 2020, and 20.3% below Q2 2019.

Heavy vehicle traffic continued its strong performance during the quarter, ending Q2 2021 31.5% higher than Q2 2020, and 0.2% higher than Q2 2019. This reflects once again that heavy vehicle traffic has been far less impacted by COVID-19 restrictions than light vehicle traffic.


At ADELAC, lockdown restrictions affected commuters using the road to travel to and from Geneva, which saw traffic in Q2 2021 71.9% higher than Q2 2020, but 27.7% lower than Q2 2019.

As of 1 July, around 51% of the French population had received at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose, with around 32% fully vaccinated. Similar vaccination rates are being achieved across the EU. Under the new EU health pass system, fully vaccinated people are able to travel across EU national borders without a requirement for a rapid test or quarantine on arrival.



Dulles Greenway

Traffic at the Greenway continued to improve throughout Q2 2021, following a recovery in traffic across off peak and weekend periods.



Traffic in Q2 2021 was 80.7% higher than Q2 2020 but remains 36.5% below traffic over Q2 2019.

Weekend traffic has recovered more strongly than weekday traffic, down only 18.1% on average compared with Q2 2019. Weekday traffic was down 39.6%. Traffic continues to recover strongly outside the morning and afternoon weekday peaks.

Following the release of the SCC Rate Case Outcome, on 5 May 2021 the Greenway increased its off-peak tolls by 5.3%. This increase supported the 84.6% increase in toll revenue during the quarter compared to Q2 2020 (35.1% down on Q2 2019).

Warnow Tunnel

The area around Warnow Tunnel, which had one of the lowest rates of COVID-19 in Germany and Europe throughout 2020, experienced a significant outbreak in early 2021. Nationwide restrictions, which were imposed in December 2020, were progressively eased in May 2021. Schools returned mid May, most shops and restaurants opened by late May and domestic tourism was permitted from early June.



Traffic in Q2 2021 was 2.3% higher than Q2 2020, but 15.6% lower than Q2 2019.

Traffic recovered quickly as restrictions were lifted. Between April and end June, average daily trips increased by around 17%, and by the last week in June were only 5% lower than 2019 levels.

Roadworks on competing routes continued despite the impact of COVID-19 restrictions. This also supported traffic at Warnow Tunnel during the quarter. These roadworks are expected to continue during 2021.

As of 1 July, around 56% of the German population had received at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose, with around 38% being fully vaccinated. This establishes a basis for greater travel within the EU under the new health pass system.
