Financial Performance

- Rex Group posted an operating loss of A\$31.7M due to:
 - Reduced passenger demand in 2H FY23;
 - Disruption in regional operations due to legacy effects of COVID resulting in acute pilot shortages and severe supply chain dislocation.
- Rex's 50% acquisition of National Jet Express (NJE) resulting in A\$44.5M positive fair value contribution.
- Consequently, Rex's statutory profit after tax for the FY 23 is A\$14.4M.

July 2022

- Rex entered into multiple commercial agreements with major Travel Industry Partners.
- Took delivery of an additional Saab 340B plus aircraft.
- Rex signed an MOU with Dovetail Electric Aviation to pioneer the conversion of turbine powered aircraft to electric propulsion.











August 2022

- Rex celebrated its 20th anniversary.
- Took delivery of 7th Boeing 737-800NG aircraft.
- Rex commenced twice-daily services between Melbourne Devonport with Saab 340 aircraft.
- Commenced construction of the new 3000 sq. m Code C hangar at Sydney Airport.











September 2022

- → Completed the purchase of National Jet Express (NJE), the Regional Services arm of Cobham Aviation Services Australia.
- → Rex Flight Attendants and Engineers agree on new enterprise agreement.
- Rex named 'Airline of the Year' at the inaugural Australian Aviation Awards for 2022 organised in partnership with UNSW.

AUSTRALIA AVIATION AWARDS 2022

October 2022

- Rex introduced real-time bidding for an upgrade to Business Class on its domestic jet services.
- Entered into interline service agreement with Delta Air Lines (DL) that allows:
 - Delta Passengers travelling from the U.S., Canada and Mexico to access Rex network;
 - Rex Passengers travelling to the U.S. easy access to nearly 50 cities;
 - Single baggage drop where permitted.











November 2022

- Rex announced 86% of its regional pilots have overwhelmingly endorsed a new EBA.
- Pel-Air accepted delivery of the last of its four new Beechcraft King Air aircraft (two B260s and two B360s) for its second consecutive Ambulance Victoria air ambulance contract commencing 1 Jan 2024 for 12 years.











December 2022

Rex announced partnership agreements with Murweh Shire Council (Charleville) and Maranoa Council (Roma) which will see their residents having access to Residents' Fare for travel to and from Brisbane.











March 2023

Pel-Air took delivery of two Pilatus PC24 jet aircraft for the New South Wales Ambulance fixed-wing air ambulance services contract. The aircraft are undergoing aeromedical modifications and the start of operations is expected in Q2 FY24.













April 2023

- Rex took a 20 per cent stake in Dovetail Electric Aviation which is pioneering the conversion of turbine powered aircraft to electric, emission-free propulsion.
- → Rex announced changes to flight schedules on its regional network across four states due to chronic shortage of airline professionals, particularly pilots and engineers, as well as the severe disruption in the supply chain of aircraft and engine parts.











May 2023

- Rex announced the commencement of flights between Adelaide and Sydney, the 8th domestic route.
- Rex welcomed the 26th cohort of Rex cadet pilots who recently graduated from the Australian Airline Pilot Academy (AAPA).











June 2023

- Announced commencement of Melbourne to Hobart services from 17 Aug 2023, making it the 4th Tasmanian destination and the 9th domestic route.
- Rex named Best Regional Airline Australia & Pacific at the 2023 World Airline Awards hosted by SKYTRAX at the Paris Airshow.

Outlook

Group Revenue expected to increase due to:

- Additional flying of up to 4 additional B737-800NGs to the fleet (3 will be in service before end of December);
- Rex Flyer (Frequent Flyer Programme) launched in Q2 FY2024;
- Influx of foreign cadets at the pilot academies with the ramping up worldwide of pilot training close to 100 new cadets from China have already arrived in FY24;
- Commencement of new Ambulance Victoria contract as well as induction of 2 Pilatus PC24 jets into the NSW Ambulance contract in 2HFY24;
- New FIFO/charter contracts for NJE.


